Handouts were provided via email regarding the divisions statistics and current budget standing. These stats are the stats from the first 6 months of FY 2022, July 1st, 2021 to December 1st, 2021. On the front page, it shows the Veterans Services Program statistics of claims produced and financial impact. On the back page, it shows the Veterans Cemetery Program number of burials and estimated revenue. It also shows the number of FTEs MVAD owns and the location of where those FTEs are allocated. The cemetery is funded through plot allowances from the VA, family payments and county payments for headstones. Those funds are considered special revenue and goes into a special revenue account. It's not a constant fund and changes every fiscal year.

MSVCP received general funding for the first time in FY 2022 of \$65,000. The program will receive \$50,000 in FY 2023. The general fund only covers the cost of 1 employee including benefits, so the division will be asking legislature to continue giving general funds and increase to cover more than 1 employee. Because the special revenue is not a reliable source of revenue, we have to explore other options of obtaining stable revenue.

for the cottages that aren't open yet. They ha	ve a secured cottage for dementia residents	that
also has a waiting list for when it opens. There a	are no COVID cases in the Buttes Veterans Ho	ome.
The Veterans Home in Columbia Falls has paus	sed admissions and has started a waiting list fo	or
admissions. They have 105 beds with 74 filled. 1	here are 30 open staffing positions that they l	have
not been able to fill. Until more staff are hired,	they will not be able to admit more patients.	
Columbia Falls has 3 residents and 10 staff sick	with COVID.

A resident that served as an Army Nurse in WWII celebrated her 100th birthday at the facility. Administrator Ackerman asked Joren if the staffing issues were because of funding. Joren said the Columbia Falls Veteran Homes is fully state owned and operated. Their budget consists of special revenue received from the cigarette tax. The other two facilities are contracted so are operated under a different budget. Joren mentioned other nursing facilities in Columbia Falls are also short staffed so it's an issue for the location. They were able to give pay increases which helped with not losing staff, but it has not helped recruit new staff.

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Chairman Stone started with the goals to accomplish for the legislative session in 2023. MVAD first drafted proposal is 10 additional FTEs that consists of 6 administrative assistants, 3 cemetery landscape technicians, and 1 accountant. MVAD is also asking for 3 additional leased vehicles, one for each bureau chief and one for the Billings office. The majority of our offices are understaffed and need assistance answering phones, replying to emails, scheduling appointments, and filing. The cemeteries are understaffed in landscape technicians, and the Eastern cemetery only has 1 employee. To be in compliance with safety protocols, it's essential to have a minimum of 2 FTE in each cemetery. The Director's Office is doing a re-organization study, and we are anticipating financial work to be passed to the division. With the extra work load, we need an additional financial employee. These legislative proposals are the first draft, and we are expecting to work on these for the next 6 months.
